Agenda:

1. CALL TO ORDER

Linda Miska called the meeting to order at 5:38 P.M. She welcomed back member Kathy Waugaman, who has been out due to surgery and rehabilitation.

2. INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS AND NEW MEMBERS

Linda welcomed new transfer member Allison Hayter from Alpha Delta Chapter in Paris, Texas.

3. SUMMER BOOKSHARE

Leaflets were distributed for members to suggest good books for summer reading to be listed in the next newsletter.

4. BIRTHDAYS / BRAG BOX / PIN DRAWING

Members who have April, May, and August birthdays were announced. Members were given an opportunity to donate dollars for "brags." Linda reminded members that next year all brag box receipts will be donated to the World Fellowship fund. Linda also asked members to be sure they owned a pin and wore it to the meetings. She reviewed pin-wearing protocol and held a prize drawing for members who were wearing their pins.

5. INSTALLATION OF NEW OFFICERS

6. INITIATION OF NEW MEMBERS

Marilyn Brooks, JoAnn Brooks, Susan Hayes, and Tonelli Hatley led the initiation ceremony for two new members:

Emily Tolhuizen (history teacher at McKinney High School; former PISD student) Members sang the Delta Kappa Gamma song at the conclusion of the initiation ceremony.

7. BUSINESS MEETING

<u>MEETING MINUTES</u>: The minutes of the March 2018 meeting were printed in the newsletter. Three corrections were made to the minutes as printed. A motion was made to accept the corrected minutes. The motion was seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT/AUDIT: Dues (\$110) or half dues (\$55) should be paid by April 30th. Linda told the members that there is a proposed amendment to the International Constitution to change the due date of annual dues to July to be in line with the fiscal year. That amendment will be discussed and voted on at the International Convention this summer. Members who are planning to attend the Founders' Day Brunch also need to pay \$27.00 for tickets. Jerry Cowan must have members' checks by April 25th. The treasurer's report

printed in the April newsletter states that there is currently \$1798.50 in the operating fund and \$1473.51 in restricted funds. The treasurer's report was filed for audit.

<u>SERVICE PROJECTS</u>: Diane Hughes reported on the preparations for the dinner that we will serve to approximately 80 - 90 people at the Journey of Hope meeting on May 10th. Jason's Deli is providing baked potatoes, and paper goods are already provided. We will bring the other food for adding to the potatoes.

If you purchase food for the dinner, please keep your receipts so you can be reimbursed. We still need volunteers to help serve the meal. Please sign up with Diane. The JOH meeting will be held at First United Methodist Church at Spring Creek and Parker at 6:00 PM. We will provide another meal for JOH on May 24th. That meal will be lasagna, and we will need volunteers for that meeting also. Sheila Alvarez reminded Diane that we also need to provide vegetable lasagna as an option for those participants who are vegetarian. Linda reminded those who will attend to take pictures for our ASTEF grant report, but to be sure not to include the children's faces for privacy reasons.

JoAnn presented information about another JOH event, Family Fest, which will take place on Sunday, April 29th. She handed out flyers with details and asked for volunteers to help with games from 12:30 to 2:00 on that day. She invited members to come and bring family, especially children and grandchildren, if they would like to attend.

Diane Hughes will also call Sonja Pegram to find out what we can do to honor teachers at Special Programs Center for Teacher Appreciation Week, and when it would be best to do something.

<u>LEGISLATION</u>: Linda Engleking gave a report on last month's primary elections and current issues before the legislature. At stake is the TRS defined benefit plans for new and active teachers. Linda requested that members stay in touch with legislators with phone calls, emails, and letters. She also urged members to put aside feelings for political parties and consider education-friendly candidates, regardless of party affiliation. There is a run-off election on May 22nd and the regular election will be on November 6th.

<u>GRANTS-IN- AID</u>: Sue Stinson reported on the recipients of the grants-in-aid who will be honored at the May Brunch, two seniors from Plano East and a paraprofessional from Schimelpfenig.

<u>YEARBOOK</u>: Linda Miska asked members to fill out and turn in new information sheets for the yearbook if any personal information has changed.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE AND COURTESY</u>: Kathy Waugaman read a thank-you letter from the DKG Campus Helping Hands organization for our donation to Hurricane Harvey relief. Our contribution went to help teachers in Taft ISD. She also read a thank-you from Journey of Hope for our contribution of curriculum books that will be used to help children who are struggling with the death of a family member.

<u>OLD BUSINESS</u>: There was no old business to discuss this month.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Chapter Merger Due to declining membership, the members of Mu Beta in Plano have asked to merge their chapter with Iota Omega. A motion was made to accept the merger, and it was seconded and approved by a unanimous vote. Linda Miska reported that about ten Mu Beta members would join us.
- International Convention JoAnn reported on preparations for the International Convention in Austin this summer. She asked for a show of hands of members who would be attending the convention, and urged others to consider attending. A motion

was made to use money from our Projects Fund to purchase a door prize to be given away at the Convention. The motion was seconded and approved. Members wrote welcome notes to convention attendees on cards designed with bluebonnet artwork by Marilyn Brooks.

- State Convention is June 14-16 in Waco; International Convention is July 16-20 in Austin.

The membership committee met at the home of Pauline Sinnamon in August to get an early start on recruitment. Those in attendance included Pauline Sinnamon, Jody Lubbers, Emily Tolhuizen, Linda Miska, Karen Farley, and Sarah Hutchinson.

The committee is in the process of calling former members of Iota Omega and Mu Beta to invite those ladies to come back to membership. The group also discussed recruitment and decided to follow the International plan for recruiting members.

Step 1 - August and early September - Members will recommend degreed women from private and public schools, colleges, corporate training, religious education, tutoring, and other areas where they are actively teaching. New members may also be former teachers who have left the profession for some reason and retired teachers. According to the new International by-laws, they may also be college students enrolled in at least their last two years of their education degrees who may be nominated for associate membership. Members do not need to ascertain whether these women may be interested in membership. Don't fail to recommend someone because you think they might not be interested.

- Step 2 Women recommended for membership will receive an invitation to a chapter meeting and an orientation meeting in September. Members should inform the membership committee of potential members, as early as possible, so the letter can be sent before Labor Day. Otherwise bring names of prospects to the September meeting.
- Step 3 Orientation of prospective members will be held in late September. Interested prospect will fill out an information sheet and be invited to the October meeting.
- Step 4 Names of prospective members will be announced at the October meeting. An electronic ballot will be sent to all members to elect prospects to membership.
- Step 5 The membership committee will send invitations to the initiation at our November meeting.

This is the information the membership committee needs for prospective members.

I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you all for being such conscientious members when it comes to taking care of matters of legislation. You have listened intently, you have asked awesome questions, and you have taken action when asked to do so. It is easy to lead a group as wonderful as you all have been. Yet, this is truly not a job that you can do alone; it takes an entire dedicated group of women to visit with legislators, write letters, and make lots of phone calls. I hope you are all up to the challenge to be prepared voters in November!

It is important to stay informed this summer and fall about the candidates and who is "Education Friendly" and deserves your vote in November. We have a real fight in front of

us in the next Texas Legislative Session, which begins in January of 2019. We need our legislators to become serious about not only children but also the teachers and other staff members that work with them. We must help them to understand that the cost of insurance is an extreme hardship on both working and retired teachers. We also need to make it clear that that they need to leave the system of the "Defined Benefits Pension Plan" alone. We truly do not want to change over to "Defined Contribution," a system where the active teacher must manage her own money for retirement. Another painful issue is the new A-F grading system for our schools and districts. Legislators need to know that this system does not and cannot define the amount of hard work and learning that goes on in our schools. This ineffective grading system will only change if the teachers, parents, and community members let them know that this system is not a true measure of what is happening in a school or district! Only by staying united can the Texas Legislature see our strength. Tell your staff, family, and friends what is going on, we need everyone on the side of education in the November election.

International Amendments of Interest

In May we discussed proposed amendments that might affect our chapter directly. Here are briefly summarized results.

- The name change did not pass.
- The term "initiation" was changed to "induction."
- An individual does not become a member until she pays her dues.
- Women who have been teachers in the past, but who are not yet retired, can become members.
- Graduate students and undergraduates in their last two years of study may become
 associate members. Their dues will be \$20.00. They will become active and pay
 member dues when they graduate. Collegiate members may not hold office.
- We may vote electronically.
- This covers payment of dues. The membership year goes from July 1 June 30. All state and international dues are due to TSO by July 1. Non-paying members will be dropped as of October 1^{st} . Members joining after January 1^{st} pay $\frac{1}{2}$ of international dues.
- The resignation of members, date, and reasons for termination must appear in the minutes.
- The initiation fees are divided Chapter \$7.50; state \$2.50. Nothing goes to international


